May brings Cindy Blackberg to Charlotte. Cindy lives in Maryville, Tennessee with her husband Bob. She began quilting in 1974 when her two sons were young. After a move to south Florida in 1977 she began to teach quilting. In the last 30 years Cindy's teaching skills have earned her a loyal following across the United States.

In 1993 Cindy won the International Quilt Festival's "Jewel Pearce Patterson Award" for teaching excellence. In 1995 she was nominated for Professional Quilter's "Teacher of the Year." She has taught in Canada, Australia, Mexico, and throughout the United States.

Her work is based on traditional American patchwork blocks. She uses many fabrics to create unique scrap quilts. Her love of quilt history has led to her own pattern line, Vintage Collections, and her first self published book, Vintage One Patch Scrap Quilts. Her workshop is on Thursday, May 7 and will be the Mariner's Compass.

## President's Message ~ Danielle Barr

**Dear Friends** ~ "Tra-la! It's May, the lusty month of May!" (Song from the musical, Camelot)

Yeppers, its May, and it brings Spring in full bloom, but also the end of our Guild year. It's a time of transition and blossoming. This will be my last letter to you; next month the gavel (and pen) will pass to Kim Profitt. I have loved being president this year, and I look forward to being a Guild member with all of you for many years to come.

In this last letter, I'd like to answer questions about my quilting. Like many of you, I submitted quilts for our recent show, and got back critiques of these quilts from our judges. In this, the last month of my presidency, I feel the need to explain to them and you why I have some "problems" with my work.

Now, I don't want to be critical of the judges, but it seems as if they don't understand the kind of challenges I'm up against when I make quilts. I'm not just talking about the normal challenges of time and inspiration, either.

First of all, it's my fabric. My fabric talks to me. Not in the way you might think, like "I saw that fabric in the shop and it spoke to me!" No, mine really talks, and it's not so nice. I hear it as soon as I walk into my sewing room.

Mostly it yells at me. It says things like, "Hey! I've been sitting on this shelf for months, when are you going to put me in a quilt?" And when I do, it complains, "Oh no! You are NOT sewing me next to THAT awful fabric for the rest of my life!" Then it struggles to pull away as I'm sewing it, so my corners won't meet correctly. Honestly! It acts like a little kid who won't let another kid touch it! The judges don't understand – they just say "Take more care in your piecing."

Then there are the rulers – they are real gremlins in my sewing room. They change themselves! I'll start out measuring six-inch borders, but when I'm done, I find some are 5 ½ inches and others are 7 inches! Clearly, rulers are liars! And I hear them giggling when I try to figure out why my quilt isn't square. But do the judges understand? NO! They simply write – "Borders are not straight and flat."

And don't get me started on bindings! Just consider that I'm trying to work with yelling fabric and gremlin rulers at the same time. And as for rotary cutters – well, I won't even get into that, except to say that rulers and rotary cutters are in a conspiracy together. They are just waiting, and as soon as they know that I'm rushed for time and need to finish that binding – well, they get ugly.

I think it's a miracle that I get a quilt completed at all! So next year, I'm thinking about including an explanation of what happened to me during the making of my quilt for the judges to consider. I'm going to tell them everything that nasty fabric said to me, and all the tricks the gremlin rulers and rotary cutters pulled on me. Maybe that will get me special award – something like – "Best Quilt Completed Under Duress". I think I deserve it, don't you?

Keep Quilting!

**Wednesday, April 8, 2009 at 6 p.m.**

President Danielle Barr called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The minutes from the March board meeting were approved as written.

Imelda reviewed the procedures for the selection and presentation of the Jane Keller award. It was decided that administration of the Jane Keller award would be combined with scholarships under Outreach rather than be managed as a separate unit.

**Programs:** The quilts display at the Daniel Stowe Botanical Garden was very well received. If this show is held again next year, it was felt that we should participate. Not only did it give an opportunity to share a love of quilting, but it was a good venue for raffle ticket sales.

**Community Education:** The raffle quilt will be on display in Asheville on April 17 preceding the May meeting when the drawing will be held. Be sure to bring all of your raffle ticket money and ticket stubs to the May meeting.

**Quilt Show:** Melanie and Elaine commented on the many nice responses they heard about the show.

**Finance:** Cindy said there is a donor contribution form for members whose employer makes a matching contribution or for donations (such as Silent Auction quilts). Transactions are being entered for the quilt show and a final report will be forthcoming.

**Website:** Elaine Dickson will be helping to develop a new guild web site that will roll out prior to Symposium 2010. The current Multiply site will be updated with a list of quilt show winners and selected pictures from the show.

**Membership:** The April meeting had 112 standing members, 1 renewal, 3 guests, and 3 new members. This brings the total membership to 224.

**Scholarship:** Patti Hayden informed the board that there were no applicants for this year's scholarship. She added that consideration should be given to moving the schedule for grant

application/award to the fall rather than the spring.

The following committees had no report: Publicity and Outreach

**Old business:** It was discussed whether to hold separate shows in 2010 for the guild and for Symposium 2010. It was moved, seconded and approved that there would be only a single show in 2010. According to the committee, any Symposium attendee or any Charlotte Quilters' Guild member may enter quilts in Symposium 2010.

## Crazy For Quilts Contest

The nonprofit Alliance for American Quilts has announced its third annual quilt contest. The theme for this one is "Crazy for Quilts," and it invites quiltmakers to play "fast and loose" with the concept of crazy quilts.

Simply create an original 16" square quilt inspired by the crazy quilt style and submit your entry to AAQ by the June 1, 2009 deadline. (AAQ turns 16 this year, hence the specific size.) You could win a fabulous prize, but even if you don't, your quilt will tour multiple venues and be shown on the Alliance's popular website. Then, next fall, all contest quilts will be auctioned off to benefit the AAQ.

To provide inspiration and to show off its recently revamped website, the Alliance has curated a special online exhibit featuring some of the 1,000-plus crazy quilts documented on its site. These beauties, both vintage and recent, represent just a fraction of the 18,000 quilt images archived at the Quilt Index, one of the projects that helps fulfill the AAQ's mission to preserve and share quilt history. Here you can read an essay by esteemed quilt historian, Merikay Waldvogel, titled "What Makes a Crazy Quilt Crazy," and click on some of the Merikay's favorite crazy quilts, including the modern crazy quilt (shown above) made by Linda Karel Sage and owned by the Museum of the American Quilter's Society (MAQS) in Paducah, Kentucky.

## **Local Quilter to appear on TV**

Lincolnton resident and Charlotte Quilt Guild member Kim Deneault will appear on “Sewing With Nancy” The show is scheduled for May 2 at 8:30am on WTVI Charlotte channel 42 the local PBS Station.

Deneault is the designer of “Raggedy Reverse Applique,” an easy technique for quilting.

Kim only started quilting 5 years ago. But, ten months after she made her first sample block she found herself in Hollywood California filming for HGTV Simply Quilts! Her unusual technique of using gummy worms to measure makes her technique a fun and fat free way to sew. Kim said first time sewers can easily catch on and are encouraged to use their own artwork.

Going from a full time Mom to filming for TV, writing a book, teaching, and lecturing has been a wonderful adventure. “I never imagined that helping my Mom with her first quilt would lead to all this.” And what does she mean by all this?

In November she taped at the Wisconsin PBS studios with Nancy Zieman for the show “Sewing With Nancy” which will air soon. Kim appeared on HGTV Simply Quilts a couple years ago. She taped two internet episodes of “KidzSew for QNNtv.com. both of those episodes were taped on her farm in Lincolnton and in Atlanta. She traveled to LaVeta Colorado to tape an episode with Ricky Tims and Alex Anderson for TheQuiltShow.com. She has written a quilting book for Krause Publishing that contains 10 patterns including “Booby Trap” her breast cancer quilt. Besides the book, Kim has 17 other individual patterns available on her website. She is a National Artesian for Bernina, a fabric rep, lecturer and teacher.

Kim has worked with the Lincolnton 4-H the past two years. She was happy to see that several of the students’ pillows won ribbons at the North Carolina State Fair.
